



#### STOWUPLAND HOUSE LEAGUE - THE COMPETITION HAS BEGUN!














#### How does it work?

 There are six Houses and they will compete to win the League each half term. You will be allocated a House and when you win House points they will go toward your House's score.


 At the end of each half term, all of the House points are added up and the winning House announced.
Members of the winning House will have a prize, perhaps ice creams or hot chocolate and donuts!


#### How to win House Points

Edmund (841-870) was King of East Anglia until he was killed by the Vikings and he became a saint. The Abbey of Bury St Edmunds was built to house his shrine.






#### RYDER

### ANDERSON



# WOLSEY



Boudicca (61AD), Warrior Queen of the Iceni tribe, based on the Suffolk/Norfolk border. Led the revolt against Roman rule.
