We attended the Championships at Haughley Park. It was an ideal location for this type of event as it contains areas of open parkland and mixed woodland. SI timing was used and standard SI cards (dibbers) were allocated to the pairs.

Pre-printed waterproof maps (Scale 1:6,000) were issued at the start. Teams took part in a Line O event (14 controls over 2.6km) and a Score O event (30 controls). Times were staggered for the Line O event and a mass start for the Score O event.
