Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for your patience over the delayed start to term as we re-roomed our timetable. The discovery of RAAC was extremely disappointing and frustrating given how much work had been undertaken in the school over the summer. Although there are certain areas of the school that we currently cannot use, the school has been repainted and new flooring has been installed in the gym. We will need to wait a little longer to benefit from the air conditioning and renewed heating which has been installed in D and E block.

I am very pleased that we have safely opened for all students after the summer break. Both students and staff have been very resilient and accepting of the changes. With students being reminded of how important The Stowupland Way is, especially as we uphold these values as we move around the school. Currently a substantial amount of work is being done on planning and sourcing temporary accommodation for the school. I will share more information about these arrangements as plans are confirmed. We also have a range of contractors on site to enable detailed surveying and engineering work to be carried out safely in the affected buildings.

Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see the NHS guidance by following the LINK.

Reading tests

We are currently in the process of conducting reading tests on students from years 7 to 11. Low reading skills are a com-

mon barrier to accessing the curriculum across all schools, and we of course want to foster a love of reading among our pupils. In the coming weeks you will receive notification of your child's reading age, but in the meantime here are some strategies we would ask you to adopt to encourage your child to read:

- · Allow your child to choose what they want to read. Getting practice with an accessible text is better than giving up on a traditional book that is geared for more advanced readers.
- · If you do find yourself offering suggestions, choose series rather than standalone books: the familiarity of a series can make it easier to understand the text and can reduce the negative feelings associated with starting a new reading task.
- Reading doesn't have to be from books. If your circumstances allow, buy your child magazines focused on areas that interest them, such as football or fashion. Allow them to choose comics or cookbooks if those are particular interests.
- · Audiobooks can be a great way to engage your child in stories and storytelling. There is good evidence that even just listening to well-read stories can improve reading cadence and fluency.
- · Model reading yourself: read as visibly and often as you can. Read the same book as your child so that you can discuss it!
