Discretionary grant for Christmas

Suffolk County Council (SCC) is pleased to confirm that a further discretionary grant is available to support low-income families over the Christmas Holiday. The grant will be issued as a £30 supermarket voucher for each eligible child and is designed to help families with their essential living costs during the school holiday.

We can also now confirm that our supermarket voucher provider company 'Sodexo Motivation Solutions UK Limited' have changed their company name to 'Pluxee UK LTD'. The process of issuing the discretionary grant vouchers will remain the same and this is purely a name change for the provider. As with previous issues of vouchers, the SCC Free School Meals (FSM) team will place the voucher order using the information provided by your child's school.
