I appreciate that Friday was a challenging day for lots of people as we all dealt with the extreme weather event that unfolded during the course of the day. I would like to thank you all for your patience and understanding as we dealt with the ever changing situation.

The end of a half term is always a good opportunity to reflect back, it is amazing how much we have achieved over 6 weeks. The number of school events and activities that have taken place beyond the regular school day is a true testimony to how dedicated and hard working the staff at Stowupland High School are. Parents have had several opportunities to attend school over this time, to meet staff and discuss students' progress. We have also been able to show our school to some potential new members of our community with our Tea and Tours and Year 6 Open Evening.

I was involved in the Year 11 "Steps to Success" evening on Wednesday. This involved some of our students having individual appointments with a senior member of staff to discuss their progress, plans for the future and how the school could support them further over the next 8 months. I always find these discussions enjoyable, hearing about the students future plans and being able to offer some guidance and views on the best way for them to achieve their desired outcomes.

Today, the John Milton Academy Trust is saying farewell to Chief Executive, Karen Grimes, who is retiring following a near 40-year career in education.

Karen said: "It has been an enormous privilege to have led JMAT since its formation in September 2016.

"I am very proud of what has been achieved by the Trust – our schools have all flourished over the years, providing excellent learning facilities for children in the area.

"I was headteacher at Stowupland High School for just over 12 years, so the school will always have a special place in my heart. I am particularly delighted to have overseen the opening of the John Milton Sixth Form and the school's Mulberry Centre for Cognition and Learning. Staff and students should be very proud of what they have achieved."

The Trust Board has appointed Mr Shaun Common as interim CEO. He has already visited Stowupland several times and is really looking forward to working with everyone after half-term.

As you may be aware, since the start of the academic year some of our classes have been taught by non specialist teachers for their French or German lessons. This reflects a national picture of the challenges in recruiting Modern Foreign Language teachers, with many schools struggling to fill the vacancies. However, I am pleased to report that following a rigorous recruitment process we have made the following appointments:

-an experienced Lead Practitioner in languages teaching, who will be starting after half term;

-an experienced, multilingual MFL teacher, starting in January;

- Head of Languages, starting January.

We have had an interim MFL consultant working with the school, helping ensure consistency and continuity of the curriculum, as well as Mrs Mayhew, our French teacher and Mrs Rhodes our teacher of German.

Mr Sim will be writing to you all separately about uniform, behaviour and attendance. The vast majority of our students have had a really successful start to the new school year. They have been meeting our expectations and collecting over 14,000 positive reward points between them. We have over 300 students who have not missed any time off school over the first half term. I hope this number stays as high over the rest of the year.

Over half term our building work will continue, initial work on preparing the 2 small areas of RAAC affected areas of our school will start so the floors can be repaired or replaced over the next few months. Our temporary accommodation will continue to be readied for occupation, with mains services being installed from the main school whilst there are no students on the school site. Hopefully when we return after half term we will have a better idea as to when they will be ready for occupation.

As you may have already read, Mrs Grimes has retired, having been the CEO of our Trust since establishing it in 2016. She has worked at Stowupland High School since 2004, leading the school as Headteacher before forming The John Milton Academy Trust. Over this time she has devoted her energy, time and passion so the students have the best possible education along with ensuring the safety and welfare for all in our school and the wider Trust. I hope you will join me and the school in wishing Mrs Grimes a wonderful retirement.
