The deadline to opt-in for Suffolk County Council funded school travel for the 2025/26 school year is fast approaching.

If your child is eligible for SCC funded school travel you will need to opt-in by **31 May 2025** to receive travel for the start of the 2025/2026 school year.

If your child already receives SCC funded school travel you still need to opt-in every year.

If your child is starting primary or secondary school in September 2025 and they are eligible for SCC funded school travel, you will have received an email with details of how to opt-in.
