Looking Ahead

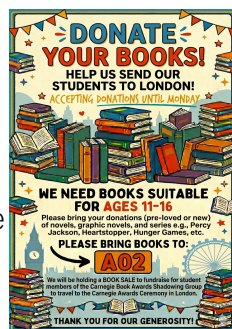
