



What skills will I acquire in Music during KS3 at Stowupland High school?

You will develop your knowledge and understanding of music by learning to perform, compose and study an eclectic range of different styles and genres. You will develop your instrumental and vocal skills, and explore cultures, musical styles and traditions from around the world. You will also build your confidence, resilience, self-discipline and teamwork skills.



What will I study in Music during KS3 at Stowupland High school?

Throughout Key Stage 3, you will learn how to play a variety of instruments in both solo and ensemble settings, such as keyboard, guitar, bass and drums, in addition to learning how to use your voice and body percussion correctly. You will also have the opportunity to use our suite of Apple iMac computers to create your own music using specialist audio production software (Logic Pro X). Students are also privileged to explore a unique range of cultural ensembles, such as Indonesian Gamelan, African Drumming and Brazilian Samba.



How will KS3 Music prepare me for GCSE Music at Stowupland High School?

There are two options for GCSE music at Stowupland High School: GCSE Music, which is aimed at those keen to develop their music performance and composition skills, and BTEC Music Technology, which is ideal for those who are interested in music production and recording. The topics that you study in KS3 directly link to both of these courses.
